# Win for Slow

Wonderful news! The Council has adopted a new Speed Management Plan (SMP) in support of government's and Waka Kotahi's national road safety strategy "Road to Zero". Arapuni Village has been added to the SMP.

Robert Cathie, Road Safety Coordinator SWDC, has confirmed the 50km/h zone will extend at the Putaruru end and stay the same at the dam end and that the 80km/h zone will be extended at both ends of the village.

This includes installing a permanent 80km/h speed limit on the following sections of road:

- Arapuni Rd from Horahora Rd to 135m north of Powerhouse Rd.
- Arapuni Rd from 320m south of Coates Rd (existing 50km/ h threshold) to the boundary with Waipa District Council
- Johnson Rd from Arapuni Rd to the end.

A permanent 50km/h speed limit will be installed on Arapuni Rd from 135m north to 335m south of Powerhouse Rd.

The SWDC is working with Waipa District Council who are currently in the early stages of their Speed Management Plan and are looking at having their side of the dam on Arapuni Rd reduced to 80km/h, if this happens we would link up so that from the Waipa side of the dam it would be 80km/h through to the 50km/h zone at the village.

SWDC can't give an exact date for the physical change as it cannot be completed until sign off, but Arapuni Village and Horahora Rd are at the top of the priority list.

Well done to everyone who submitted a proposal and attended the meetings and thanks to AVCA members past and present for keeping up the korero with Council.

### Arapuni the Plan

There was a good turn out of villagers to the Council presentation seeking feedback on the draft Arapuni Concept Plan. Council representatives were checking that the plan priorities were still relevant to the community. There was strong support for addressing traffic concerns and surprisingly we got a win here.

## **Fibre is Coming**

The Arapuni Concept plan identified digital connectivity (or lack of) as significant frustration for residents.

There's progress here too with Chorus announcing that it is extending its fibre optic cable network to Arapuni, bringing faster, more stable broadband to our village. This significant development provides an alternative to wireless broadband, utilising light to transmit data, fibre optics ensures quicker speeds and minimal data loss.

The first phase of Chorus' fibre network expansion is targeting communities close to their existing network, enabling an efficient and rapid rollout. The fibre build programme is already underway and is anticipated to be completed by mid-2025.

The scheduled date to build fibre in Arapuni is late January 2025. This is only an estimated time frame and may change depending on Chorus' build schedule.

This upgrade is a big step forward in keeping Arapuni at the forefront of modern, highspeed connectivity. The Council approach is district wide and they will not be replicating services in each centre. They heard that digital connectivity and village tidiness is still a concern. They also offered to facilitate discussions with Mercury Energy around the poor state of the driveway to the swing bridge used by visitors. Their intention is to take the feedback from the meeting and update the Concept Plan and recirculate it.

# Love a Good Book

Our village book libraries have been a cherished resource, providing literary delights to all. However, a recent concern was raised about books being taken for resale. After careful consideration, AVCA acknowledges that policing this issue isn't feasible. Instead, our focus is on maintaining the service.

To ensure our book libraries remain vibrant and inviting, AVCA has identified the need for repairing and repainting the library boxes. Additionally, we aim to enhance the quality of books available by removing any that may have seen better.

We're connecting with the kind hosts of our libraries to organise an inside and out spruce up. Let's work together to preserve and enhance this wonderful community resource. If you're able to help, let us know.
